

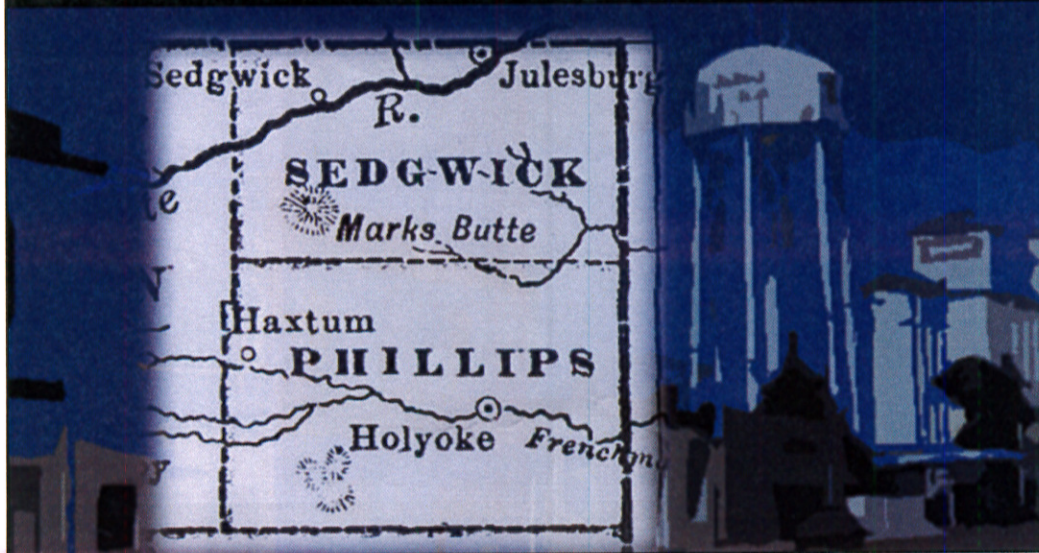

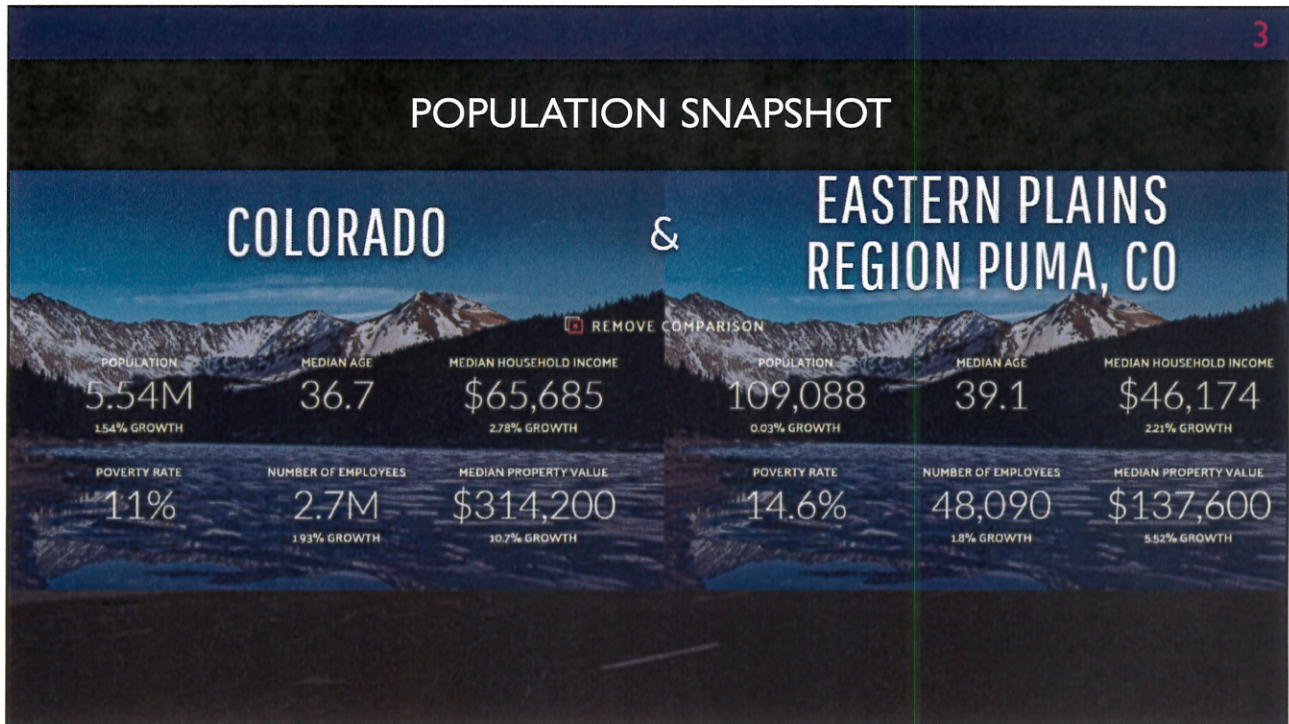

*public microdata was explored for relevant topics

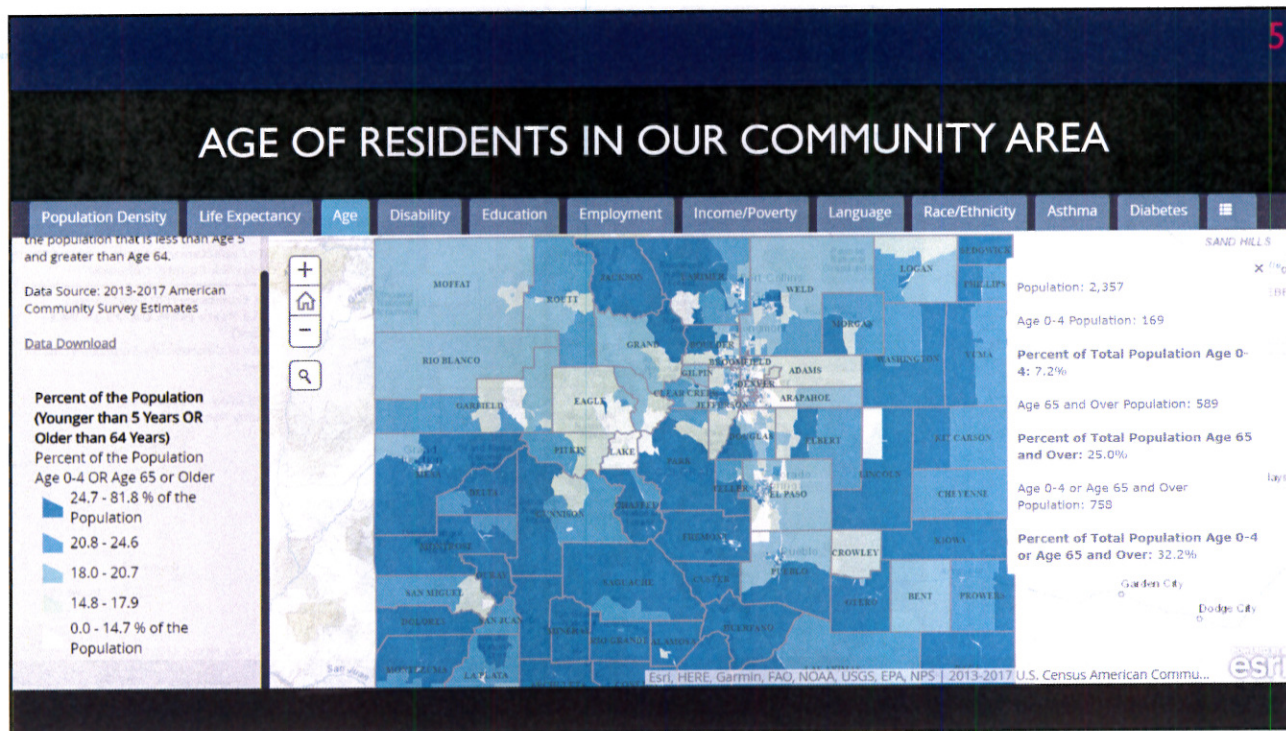

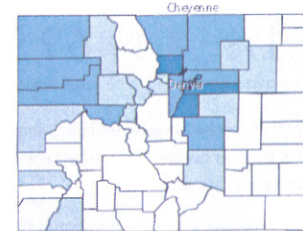

Average Wage Distribution in Colorado by County

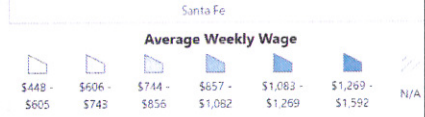

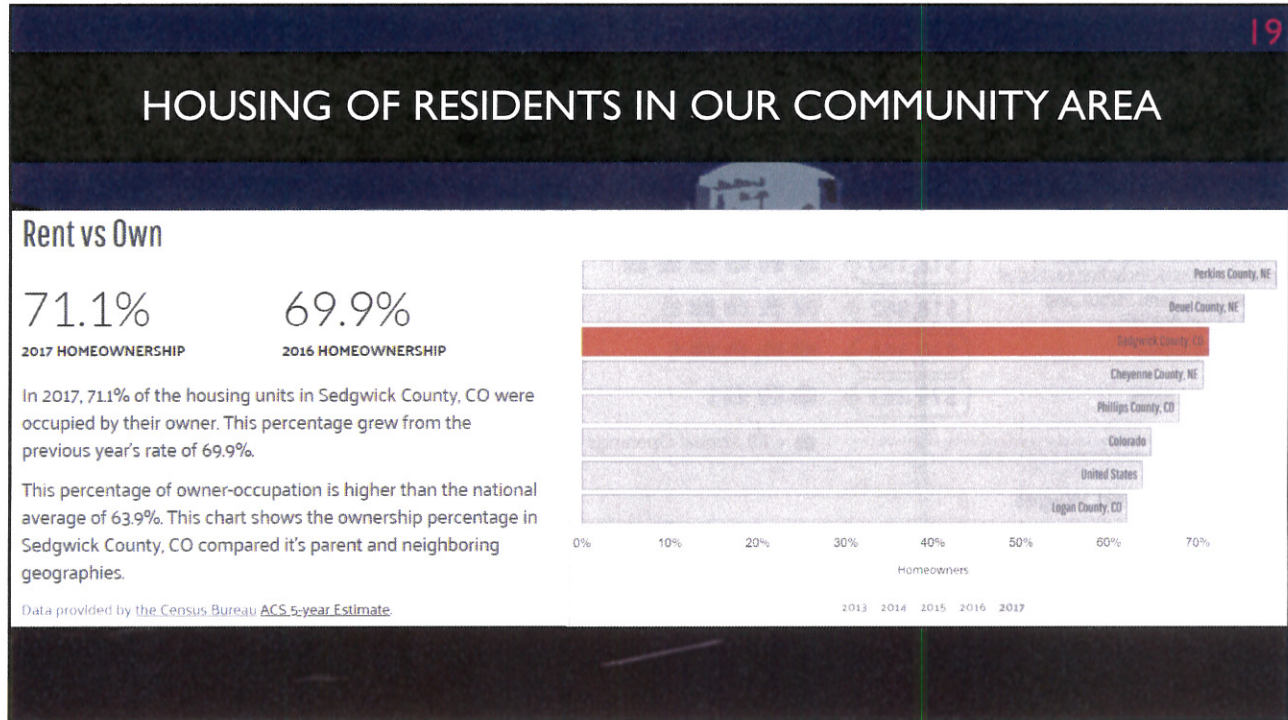
Living Wage Calculation for Sedgwick County, Colorado

The living wage shown is the hourly rate that an individual must earn to support their family, if they are the sole provider and are working full-time (2080 hours per year). All values are per adult in a family unless otherwise noted. The state minimum wage is the same for all individuals, regardless of how many dependents they may have. The poverty rate is typically quoted as gross annual income. We have converted it to an hourly wage for the sake of comparison.

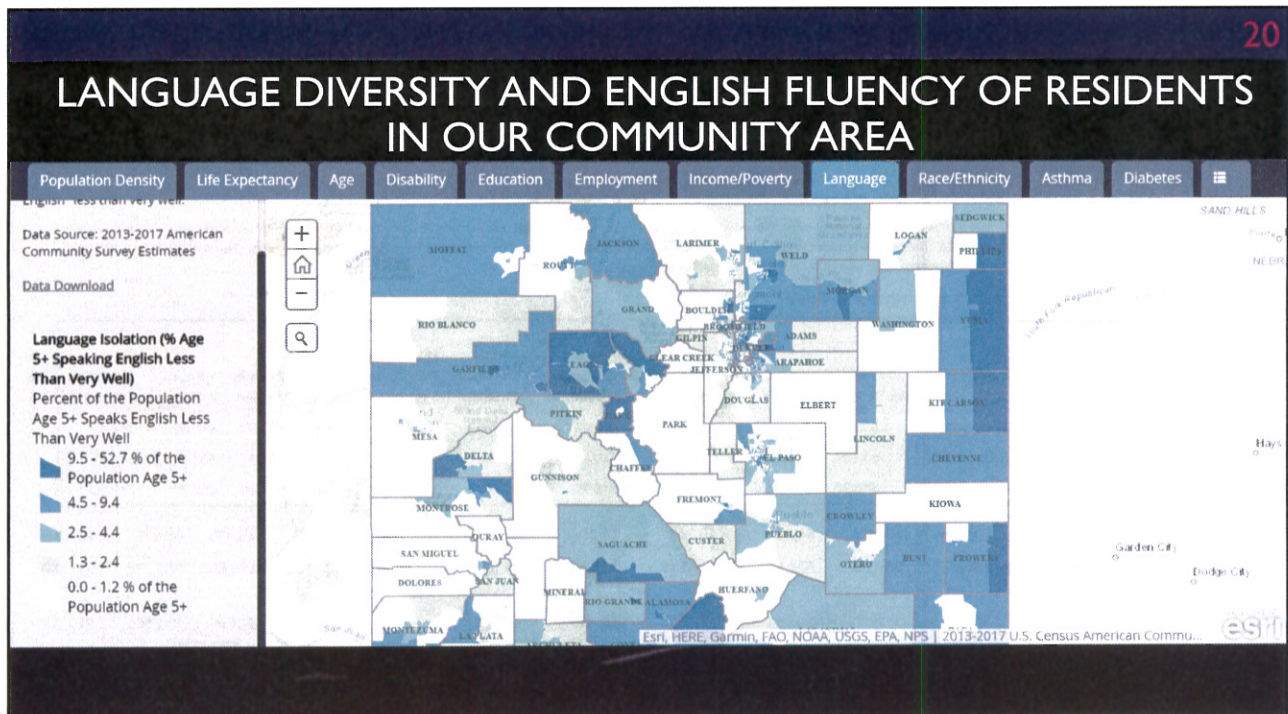

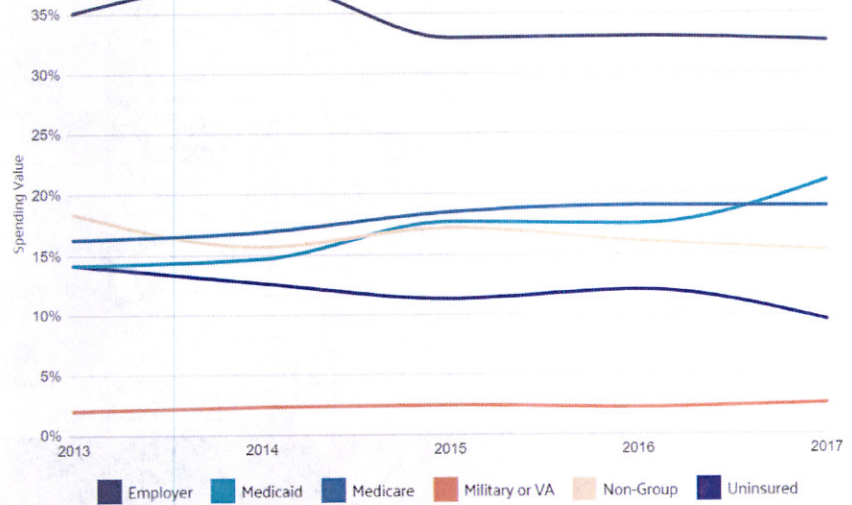

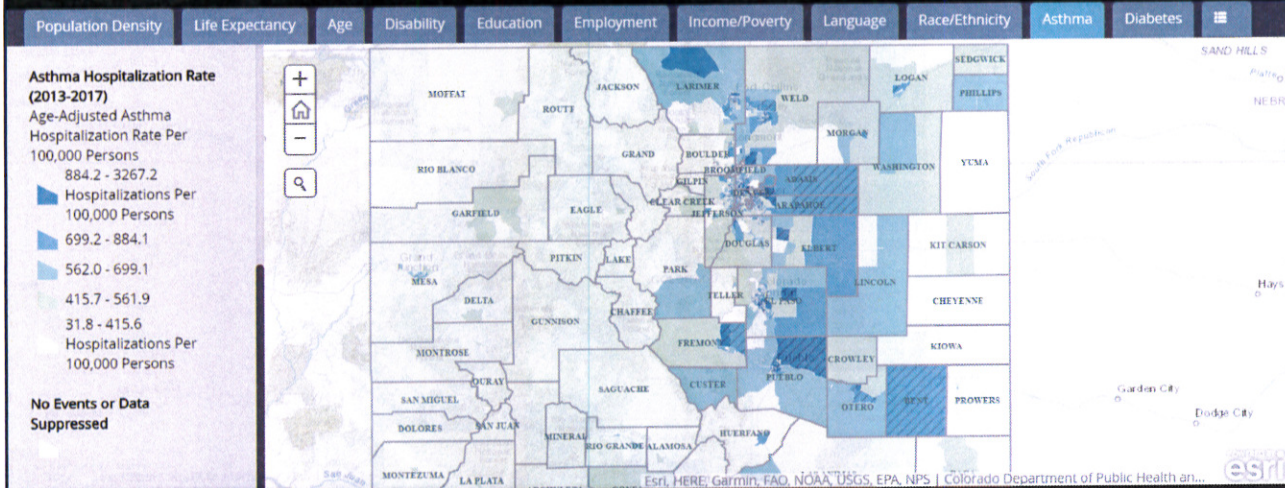
Between 2016 and 2017, the percent of uninsured citizens in Sedgwick County, CO declined by 20.7% from 12% to 9.5%

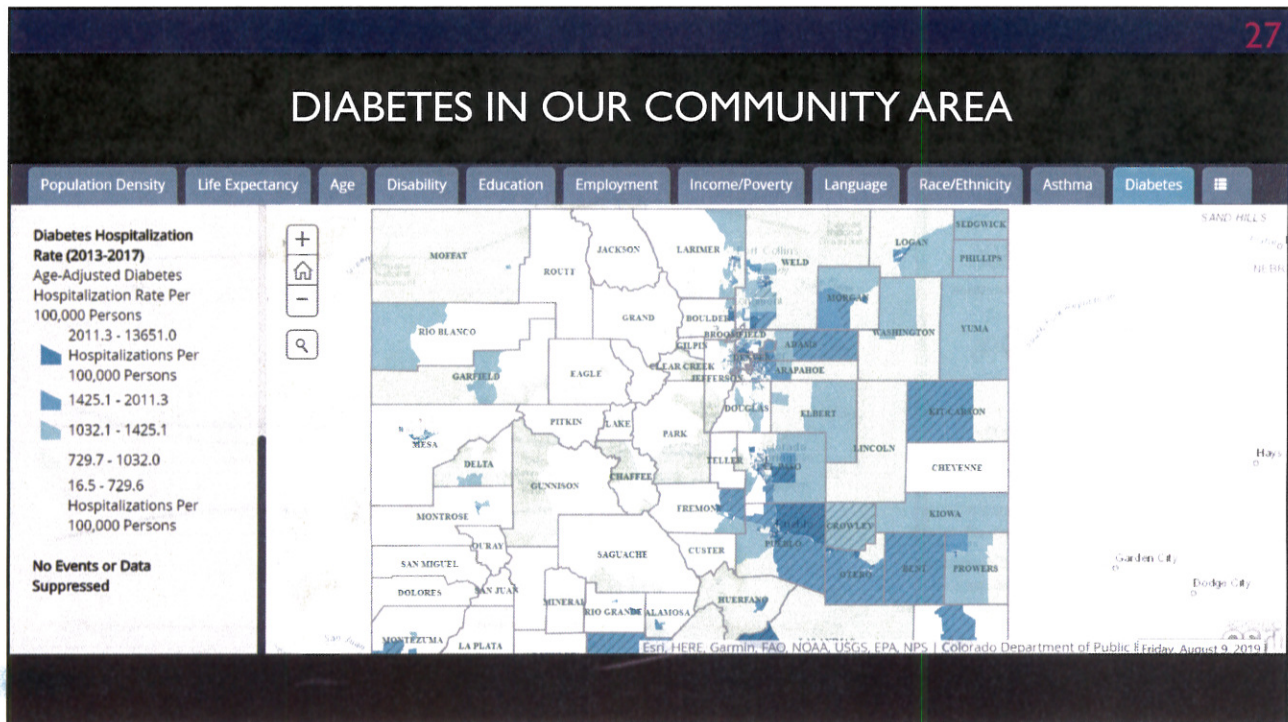
The following chart shows how the percent of uninsured individuals in Sedgwick County, CO changed over time compared with the percent of individuals enrolled in various types of health insurance.

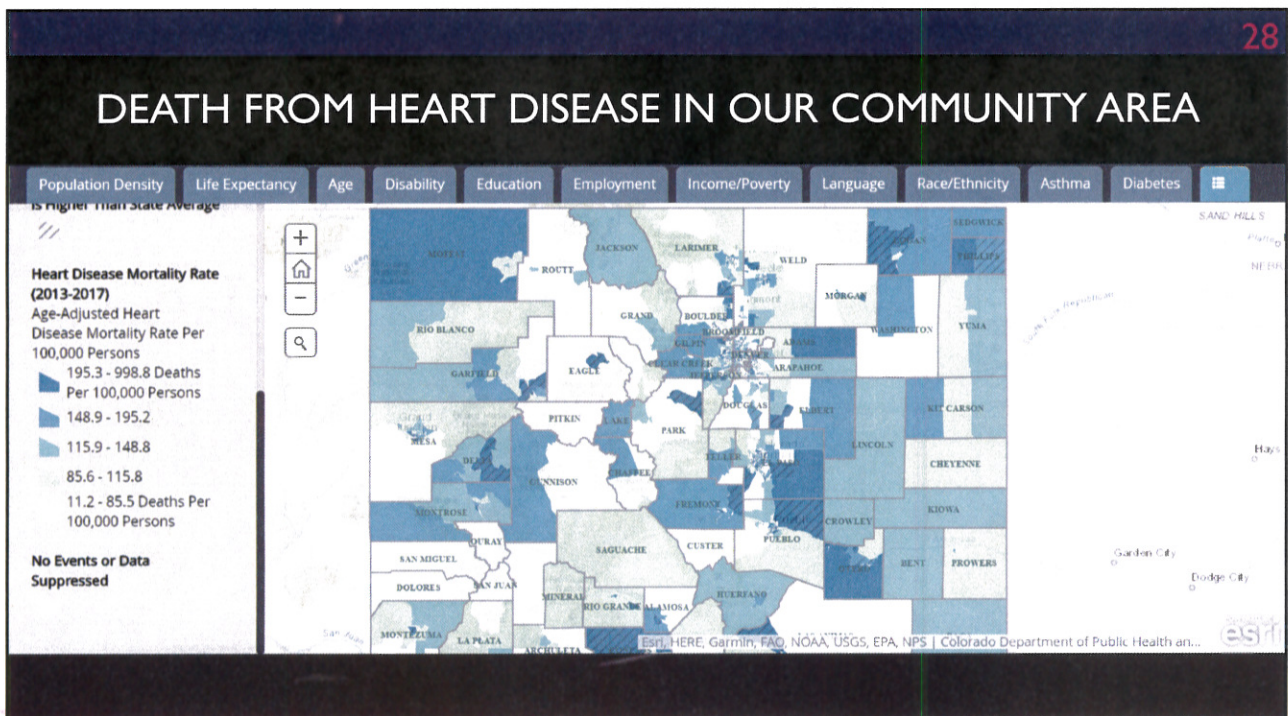

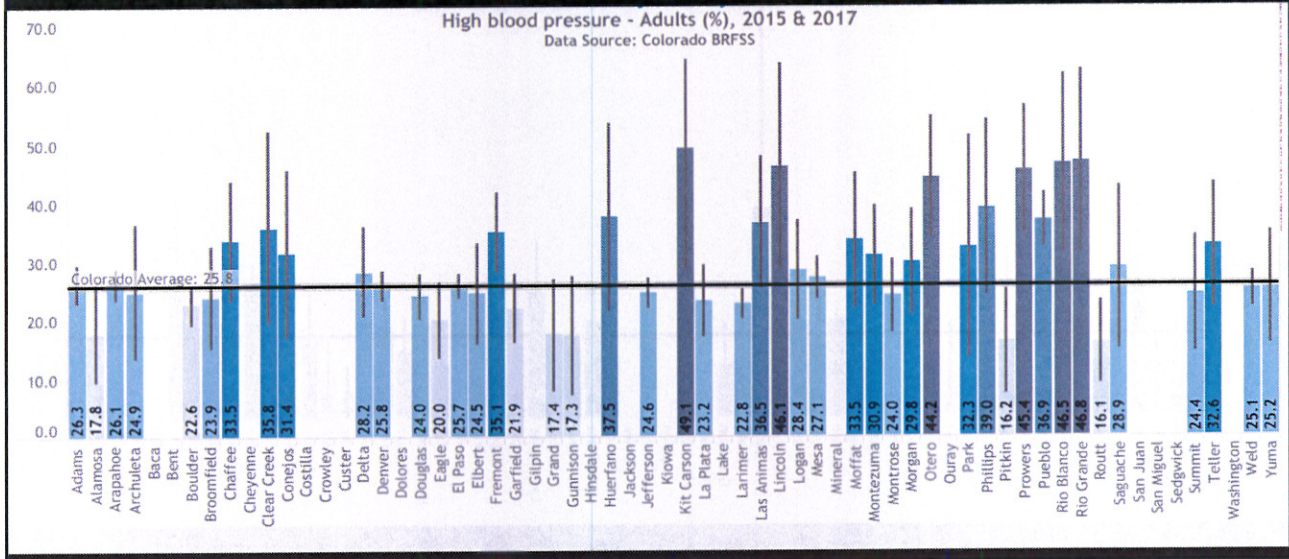

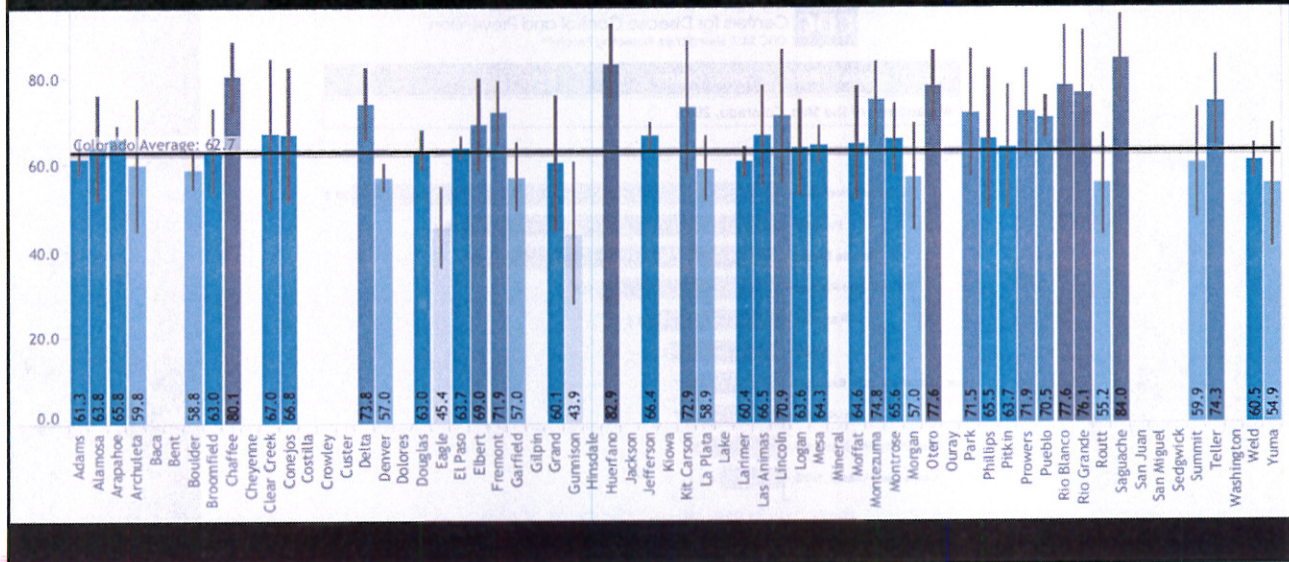
HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE IN OUR COMMUNITY AREA (2015 & 2017)



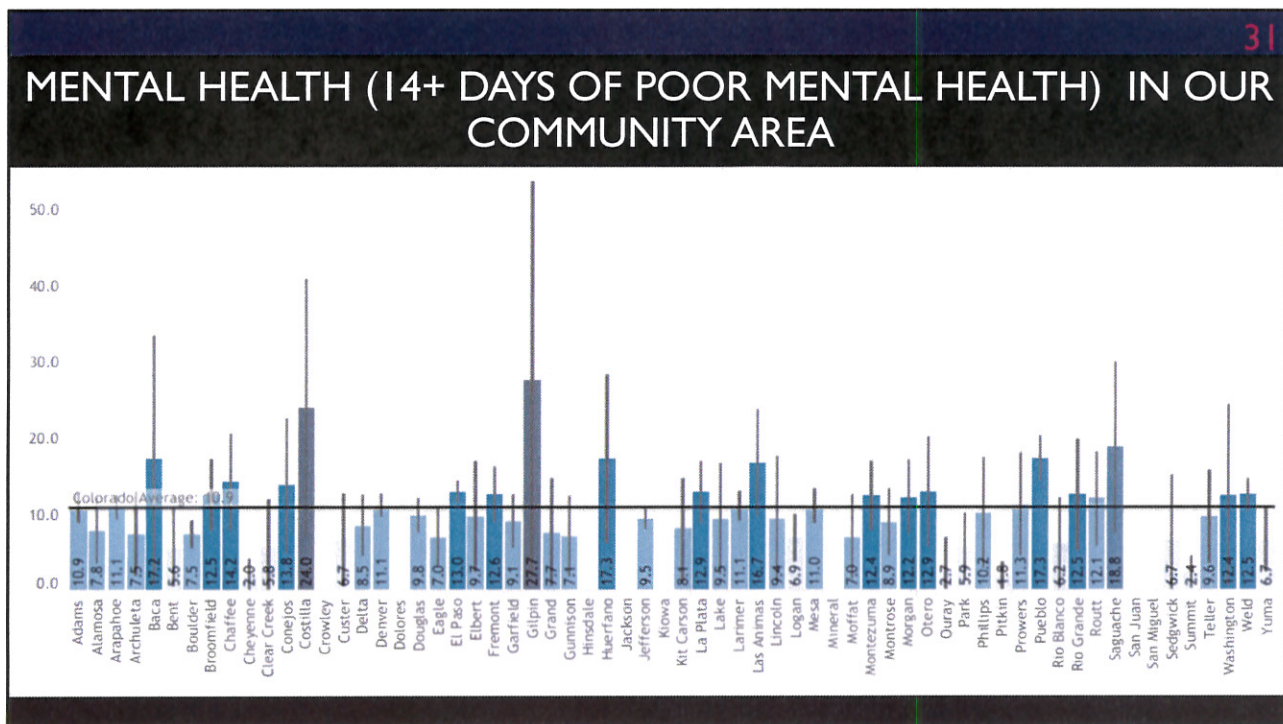

LOW BIRTH WEIGHTS IN OUR COMMUNITY AREA



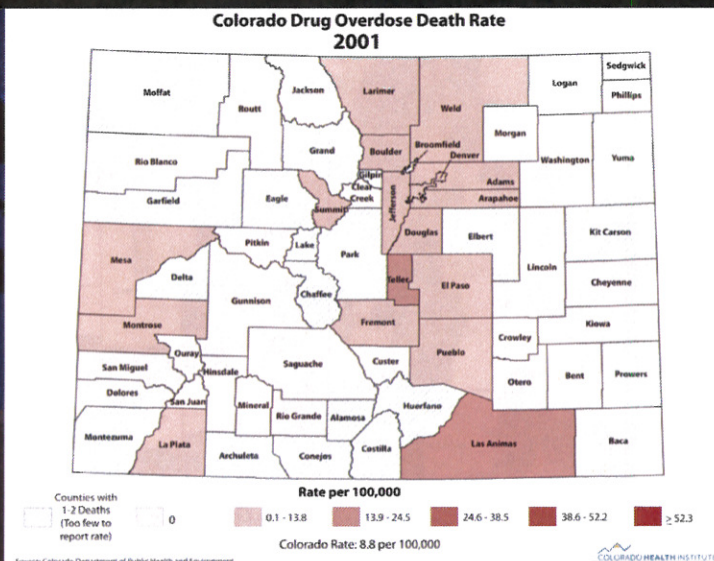

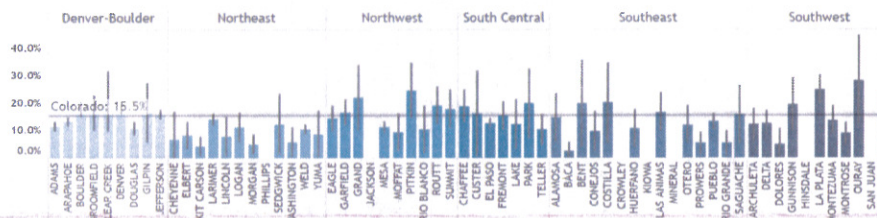
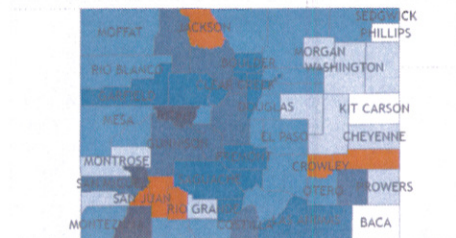
DEATHS FROM DRUG OVERDOSE IN OUR COMMUNITY AREA



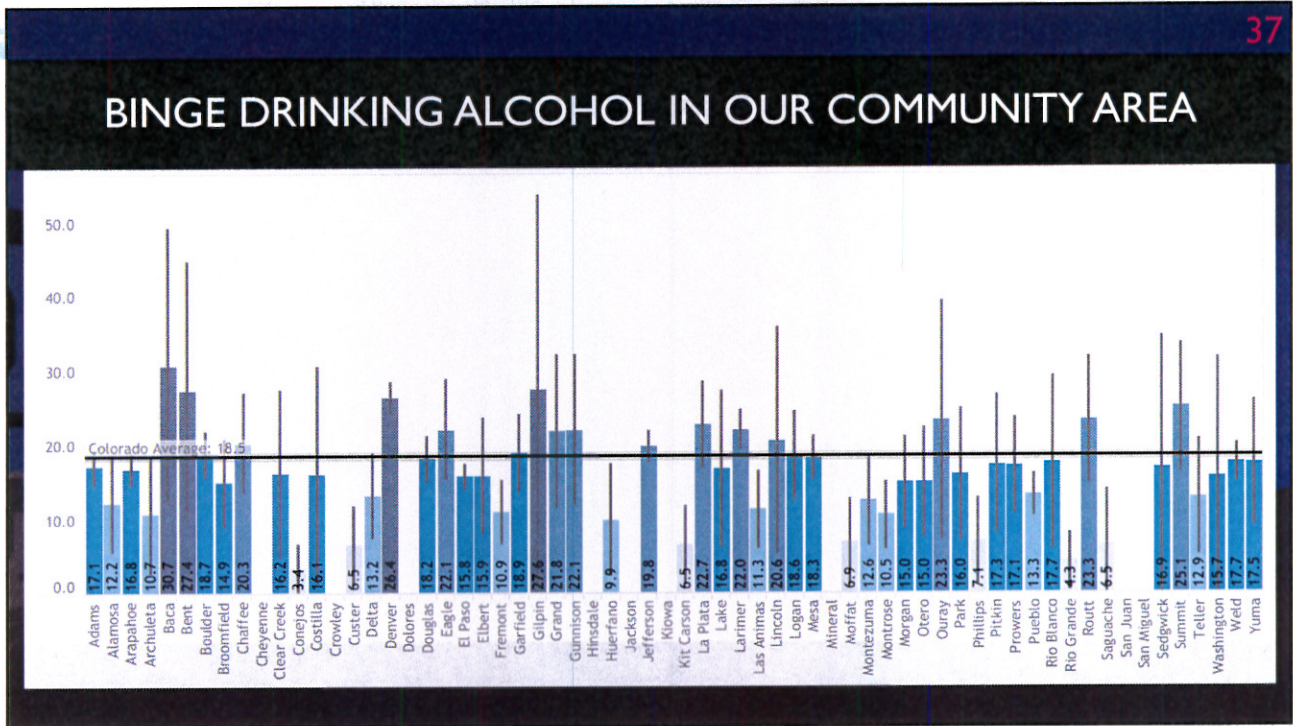

Extreme Heat[†]

Extreme summer heat is increasing in the United States, and climate projections indicate that extreme heat events will be more frequent and intense in coming decades. Extremely hot weather can cause illness or even death. Knowing how hot it gets in your area can help you prepare for extremely hot temperatures and prevent heat related illness.

Sedgwick County had 62 Days with maximum temperatures above 90°F during May–September 2016.
